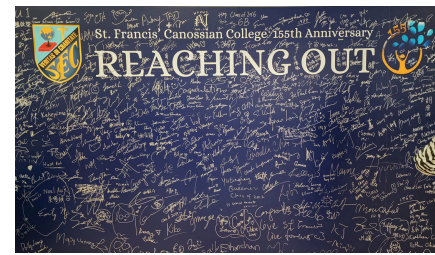

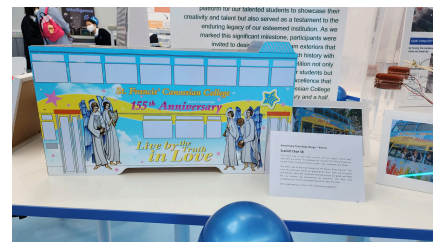

When one enters the basketball court, one cannot help being attracted by the SFCC Monopoly game at the centre. Children happily participated in the game aiming to win attractive souvenirs. There were also other games at the side such as Campus Puzzle and Proverbs Adventure.



At the Steam room, extracurricular activities of students nowadays were displayed. On 10 December 2023, PSA organized the first ever Poon Choi Lunch Gathering immediately after the closing of the School Open Days. At the school's covered playground on LG2, 180 teachers and alumni joined the event. Before the lunch started at 1pm, alumni walked around searching and reuniting with friends as well as took photos in front of the big poster and decoration.



All enjoyed a delicious lunch while watching the delightful pop songs performance by the school's chamber music team. We were lucky to have “元朗屏山盤菜”, the very popular Poon Choi service provider to deliver the delicious dishes, tables, chairs and cutleries to our school. Be the bond when we depart.

Touch your EAR.

Thank you, Mr Law. Thank you for your invitation. Thank you to you all. I am honoured to be here to share my positive energy with you.

My findings on happiness and well-being have helped people from 3 to 80 years old, they all call me Sylvia. If you call me Sylvia, you are within this range of age.

Recalling my sweet memories, 13 years from primary to secondary schools, moving from one floor to another floor, from one block to another block, within the same zone, Kennedy Road. I share the same feeling with you today when I left the **same comfort zone** more than 40 years ago.

How could we **stay happy** at every stage of life? In fact, Happiness is with you all the time.

Where is your EAR? Here, happiness is like EAR, it is with you all the time.

Let's touch our EAR. It's a **Happy Habit**. Also a **healthy habit**.

EAR. E stands for **Enjoy**. It's a verb. Action is required.

Enjoy learning and work like play (playing games).



(**Guess what subject** I like most. Yes, Chinese History.) Miss Lam, Chinese History teacher, I should take this opportunity to extend my thanks to Miss Lam. Chinese History, some people find it boring, but she made us love this subject. She taught Chinese History by telling stories "Once upon a time, there was an emperor called 秦始皇 (Ancient King).

時間人物地點 Time People Place. She separated the class into 4 groups, take turn to be **Time, People, Place, and Ending**. We were happy to study and get well prepared before class so as to **enjoy** the game (of Chinese History).

I also recalled some big brothers and sisters came to play group games with us. Some classic games. Interactive and enjoyable. I was shy, very shy at that age. Very afraid of not being accepted by others and sensitive of being judged by others. Playing together, break the ice, we know each other better. I apply the same skills from **playground to classroom**, and from **school to workplace**. We learn together as happy as play.

Guest of Honour's Address

Play with rules, work with rules. We adjust and adapt from time to time to different games of rules. Every new subject, every new task, each have their own rules. You should get used to read the project guidelines before you play the game along the years of study.

After graduation, what will you do? What will you study?

In my case, I studied hotel management after leaving SFCC, I worked in the hotel industry for **15** years, then I changed my career path to education sector for another **20** years till now.

Lifelong learning. If you enjoy learning, you enjoy lifelong.

Something we learn for no reasons; it applies for some reasons.

For example, **Housework.** How tiring? I learnt housework at home for no reasons. I learnt Home Economics (that is, cooking and sewing) at secondary school. I applied at Hotel Management, housekeeping, catering. So useful. This helps me enjoy travelling, delicious food and comfortable accommodation.

It seems like learning and work is a set of game rules, you can **master happily** when you **play similar rules** before.

When you find that game rules are similar and interlinked. You become happy with **confidence**.

By the way, there's a **Harvard longitudinal study**, over 70 years, participants were graduates of Harvard School, CEO, senior management and many other successful people. Finding out what are the common success factors of successful people. There are 2 key success factors: They do **housework** and grow up in a **loving** environment.



One major housework is cooking. Do you like cooking? The process involves a lot of **management concepts**. Planning, organising, communicating, and controlling.

Thanks mum for allowing me to do housework.

Enjoy learning and work like play. So, play more interactive games, you will be happy and innovative, and can enjoy more in this fast-paced, ever-changing world. See, all kinds of **future jobs** are yet to be named.

EAR. A stands for **Appreciate**. (Let's touch our ear!)

The habit of appreciation makes you **friendly**.

1/ Smile for a mile. Appreciate with a smile.

Pinpoint weaknesses: You collect trash and become **a rubbish bin**.

When you build a habit of appreciation, catching people doing right, you become **a treasure box**.

Why blame the **fish** in your work group who cannot **climb trees**.

Doing projects together, you highlight **strengths**, what people are able to do, the whole team can enjoy the collaborative efforts and achievement. Celebrate success together, even minor ones.

2/ NETWORKING. (Everyone knows) Making more friends and build relationship is very important. **Appreciation makes us happy with people.**

You cannot please everybody, but you can appreciate people's unique styles. There are different types/ levels of friendships.

Some are dining type, happy to explore good food and drink with them, they are good at food appreciation.

Some are at heart-to-heart talk level, they can keep what we talk confidential.

Grateful to our School, our School **already provides us a strong network.**

Franciscans are close friends. I still have bonding with classmates after graduation. I join school events and activities regularly. We meet and greet not only with the classmates of our year but also graduates of other years. Tips of today. We compare and contrast. We digest and apply flexibly. We have reflective thinking.

EAR. R stands for **Reflect.** (Here's the third habit)

The habit of Reflection can **multiply** the positive impact.

Upon graduation, at this moment. What images pop up in your mind now.

Recall sweet memories, smile, stay happy and positive.

What's the FLOW. You **ENJOY**, you **APPRECIATE**, gain positive energy, collect all these images.

This collection of **positive images (DATA)** saved in your mind (like piggy bank). Very useful in your lifetime.

Wishing you and your family happy and healthy at every stage of life!

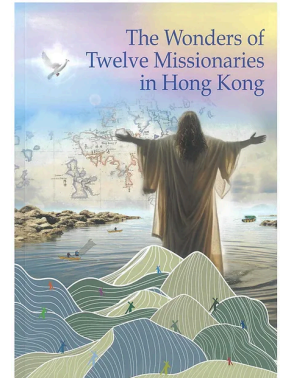


IN LOVING MEMORY OF MRS. LUCY HIEW AND MISS STELLA CHOW

GOOD BOOK RECOMMENDATION THE WONDERS OF TWELVE MISSIONARIES IN HONG KONG

This book was written by our alumna Dr. Chang Sau Han, Maria Joyce and mentioned twelve missionaries including six priests, five religious sisters and one lay woman. Two of them were Canossians - Mother Buratti Nedda, FDCC, first principal of SFCC and Mother Valsecchi Margherita, FDCC, who served at our primary school. Two out of the six priests that the book mentioned were Bishops and one of them came to our school and taught us religion once a week.



"In this book I attempt to highlight the life experiences of twelve missionaries whom I have encountered in my journey of faith. Each one of them had in some aspects shed light and impact on my Christian formation. As a result, what I have learned from them evoke in me an immense sense of gratitude, esteem and admiration and frequent gratitude to the Creator who masters over our lives. In reflection, sharing these memories and experiences may echo in readers, some form of similarities and responses in the Christian faith. I discover some unique characteristics among them.
