

Moments of Grace – The School Redevelopment Project

With the completion of Phase One of the School Redevelopment Project in October 2014, the new main block came into service in November 2014. This is followed by Phase Two of the building project which commenced in mid-April 2015 involving the demolition of the vacant old school compound and construction of an amphitheater, a library, an open playground and a link bridge joining the main school building and the assembly hall building.

2016 has seen tremendous challenges and endeavor as the school redevelopment project entered its significant stage. Foundation works were met with difficulties that were beyond possible pre-planning. Yet, day by day, on-site construction works were moving ahead. The superstructure works near the Assembly Hall Building which started in November 2016 are now in full swing. The entire school redevelopment project is expected to complete by September 2017.


Functions
